

FAITH AND FAMILY TAKE CENTRE STAGE IN GRACIE

ATP's latest show by Joan MacLeod presents the humanity behind the headlines of an isolated polygamous community through the eyes of a young girl.

CALGARY, ALBERTA – Governor General's Award-winning playwright Joan MacLeod returns to Alberta Theatre Projects from February 28 – March 18, 2017 with her latest creation, *Gracie*. Produced in association with the Victoria-based Belfry Theatre, ATP's third premiere of a new play in their all-Canadian season tells the story of a young girl growing up in a polygamous Fundamentalist Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (FLDS) community. Caught between her growing interest in the outside world and the mounting pressure to conform to her community's traditions, young Gracie is forced to confront the uncomfortable realities of a faith that sacrifices the needs and desires of so many of its members for the benefit of few.

Inspired by real-life events in the polygamous community of Bountiful, British Columbia that have recently made headlines with the conviction of two members of the community for transporting a young girl across the American border, *Gracie* continues MacLeod's signature style of taking front-page news stories and bringing them to the stage with a trademark tenderness and a lack of judgement. This is also MacLeod's fourth premiere of a new play in affiliation with ATP following *The Valley* (2013), *Another Home Invasion* (2009), and *The Shape of a Girl* (2001).

"I found my way into telling this story through Gracie's voice, and it's her voice that this play centres around more than anything else. Though her story is set in circumstances that are difficult, it's not a heavy play. There's so much levity that comes from the fact that she's a child who's not so different from other children despite her unusual upbringing," says MacLeod.

Directed by Calgarian Vanessa Porteous, *Gracie* marks her third collaboration with MacLeod, as well as being her last directorial effort as ATP's Artistic Director.

"I'm such a huge fan of Joan MacLeod's work, and am beyond thrilled to direct this world premiere," says Porteous. "I can't imagine going out on a better note than with this beautiful, moving, deeply human story. It encompasses everything I love about the theatre."

Gracie also features the talents of solo performer Lili Beaudoin, whose portrayal of a girl between the ages of eight and 15 has been praised since the show's debut at the Belfry Theatre earlier in the month.

Gracie runs from **February 28** to **March 18** at the **Martha Cohen Theatre** at Arts Commons (215 8 Ave. SE). Tickets are available at www.atplive.com or 403-294-7402.

The play is suggested for ages 14+ due to the mature nature of some of the subject matter.
