## ALBERTA THEATRE PROJECTS BRINGS W.O. MITCHELL'S CURLING CLASSIC BACK TO THE MARTHA COHEN THEATRE STAGE

**CALGARY, February 20, 2024** – After over 25 years, <u>Alberta Theatre Projects</u> (ATP) is thrilled to be bringing W.O. Mitchell's hilarious smash-hit comedy, *The Black Bonspiel of Wullie MacCrimmon*, back to the Martha Cohen Theatre. A nod to the company's past, and a springboard into ATP's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Season next year in 2024-25, this new take on Mitchell's classic rural Alberta play about curling is running from February 20 until March 10. Calgary will be awash with curling action and curling stories this February: the first week of ATP's production coinciding with the final week of the 2024 Scotties Tournament of Hearts.

"We are excited to bring back a classic Canadian play with a fresh twist," says ATP Artistic Director Haysam Kadri. 
"The Black Bonspiel of Wullie MacCrimmon takes centre stage (ice) as the Scotties Tournament of Hearts sweeps its way into our city! Amidst the hustle and bustle of Calgary in February, all eyes will be on the long-standing traditions of curling and ATP's storied history, as two iconic institutions coincide to create an unforgettable bonspiel experience."

The play follows Wullie MacCrimmon, a shoemaker in the 1930s foothills town of Wild Rose. When one day, Wullie muses aloud that he would give anything to skip his curling team in the MacDonald Brier, the Devil (a travelling salesperson who deals in wholesale souls and retail sin) suddenly appears and makes him an offer. Wullie makes a counter offer, and one of the greatest matches in curling history is on – the Black Bonspiel! When the Devil appears with a curling team—Judas Iscariot (second), Macbeth (third) and Lizzie Borden (skip)—Wullie and his team are in for one hell of a match.

ATP first produced *The Black Bonspiel* in 1997 in association with Mount Royal College (Department of Theatre and Speech). The first two professional stage productions were done by the Peterborough Festival of Canadian Theatre in 1977, and Theatre Calgary in 1979. To date, there have been over seventy productions of W.O. Mitchell's classic play.

"To me, this show is a celebration," says *The Black Bonspiel's* director, Christian Goutsis. "It's a celebration of ATP's past, while also celebrating a new dawn for ATP as the company heads toward a 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. It's a celebration of an amazing cast of Alberta actors, and of a renowned Western Canadian writer, who himself was celebrating the prairies, and the characters who inhabit it, with this play."

"Most of all though," Goutsis adds, "It's a celebration of the great game of curling!"

The play's scripted bonspiel requires the characters to hit certain shots, so the large cast of ten Alberta actors took to the rink earlier this month at the Acadia Recreation Complex to prepare for the curling action in the play. Scott Reid's set includes a fully functioning curling sheet – not of ice, but of a combination of materials that together, achieve the right amount of slipperiness – complete with real curling rocks and 1930s curling brooms for the actors to use.

Calgarian Christian Goutsis directs *The Black Bonspiel of Wullie MacCrimmon*, and the cast includes Kevin Corey (Wullie MacCrimmon), Kira Bradley (Clock Shirley Brown), Sheldon Elter (Pipe-Fitting Charlie Brown), Natascha Girgis (O. Cloutie), David Haysom (Macbeth), Emily Howard (Lizzie Borden), Valerie Planche (Annie Brown), Trevor Rueger (Reverend Pringle), David Sklar (Judas Iscariot) and David Trimble (Malleable Charlie Brown).

The Black Bonspiel of Wullie MacCrimmon runs from February 20 – March 10 at the Martha Cohen Theatre at Arts Commons. Tickets at albertatheatreprojects.com.
