Vertigo Theatre, Alberta Theatre Projects, Lunchbox Theatre, and Theatre Calgary will be holding joint General Auditions in Calgary on **February 5, 2024**, and **February 6, 2024**. Representatives from each company will be in attendance. At this time, we are only accepting applications from artists who can make in person auditions, with priority given to Calgary and Alberta locals.

TO PREPARE:

Please prepare two contrasting monologues **or** one monologue and one song totaling no more than 4 minutes. If you are performing a song and wish to use a backing track, please bring it on a device with an auxiliary output to connect to the provided speakers.

The deadline for submissions is January 14th, 2024, at midnight. Successful applicants will be contacted to schedule an audition time. Of the artists selected to be seen, Equity members will be given priority scheduling.
