Newly-arrived in France, Queen-to-be Catherine de Medici must contend with her unruly husband, a scheming lady-in-waiting and the king's power-hungry mistress as she struggles to give the kingdom what it needs most: an heir. But it's Pete, the King's pet wildman, a caged-oddity kept for amusement, who has the most surprising impact on their lives. His friendly and feral presence gradually awakens Catherine's own wild side, and once she unleashes it, no one is safe from her vengeful wrath.

A viciously bold and sexy comedy, *WILDWOMAN* is about what happens when we let the monster out. Being bad never felt so good.

Catherine de Medici (Cathy) - she/her, any ethnicity

Age spans 14-53, casting late 20s-early 40s

A princess, then the Queen of France: pragmatic and intelligent, driven towards power, resilient. She can be naive but cunning, and her shrewdness both allows her to stay resilient in the court and also keeps her hyper-aware of her own status and lack of agency in the court. From an extremely powerful family, she comes to France thinking she will have political influence and instead is treated as a royal baby-maker.

Kitty - she/her - any ethnicity

Age spans 16-55, casting late 20s - early 40s

A kitchen wench to lady's maid, precocious, brazen, quite free-spirited. Goes from being a hard-edged, sexual girl to a maternal, witty woman. While bold and a bit of a know-it-all, she ultimately is just seeking for safety and care, which is constantly achieved and then immediately lost. Wiley and funny, she is a constant source of irritation and aspiration for Cathy.

Henry II - he/him - any ethnicity

Age spans 14-40, casting late 20s - 30s

A prince, then King of France. Physically skilled and committed to the image of royal majesty, yet insecure in his power and authority, and lacking the charisma and confidence of his father. Emotionally dependent on Didi (his mistress and tutor). Obsessed with oddities of humanity and the idea of being a "Man". Childish and impertinent when not getting his way. Stems from growing up extremely isolated and feeling unvalued by his family.

Diane de Poitiers (Didi) - she/her - any ethnicity

Age spans 33-72, casting 50s - 60s

Henry II's older mistress, a lady, graceful, educated, charismatic. She is proud of her place in the court and influence over Henry, and enjoys being an object of sexual and emotional resource desire to Henry. She holds extraordinary influence over Henry and therefore all of France.

* This role may include nudity; decisions will be made in conversation between the Artist and Director, and include any other appropriate consultants

Pete - he/him - any ethnicity

Age spans 18-43, casting 20s - 30s

A wildman covered in hair, who then becomes a cover-of-paperback-novel-hot sex symbol. His modest beginnings give him a simplistic loyalty but he becomes well educated and capable of great contemplation and philosophy. He is half golden retriever, half sensitive poet. Devoted, loving, and easily walked over.
